Aims and Outcomes

As a school we strongly encourage the wearing of a uniform. Our policy is aimed at ensuring that children arrive for school sensibly dressed in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical. We believe that a simple uniform is not only practical and smart but that it also helps the children to develop a sense of pride in their appearance and a sense of belonging to the school.

School Uniform

Pupils are expected to wear the following uniform when participating in a school-organised event either inside, or outside, of normal school hours unless otherwise advised.

- Grey skirt, pinafore, trousers or shorts.
- White shirts, blouses or polo shirts.
From Sept 2019 shirt or blouses only for Year 6, no polo shirts.
- Navy pullover, tank top, cardigan or sweatshirt.
- Hoodies and caps never allowed in school at any time.
- Navy and yellow school tie (optional for Year 3 to Year 5).
From Sept 2019 ties compulsory for Year 6.
- Blue and white checked or striped summer dress if desired in the summer.
- Flat black, plain shoes of sensible design.
- No boots and no trainers apart from plain black “trainer type” shoes; children are not permitted to change shoes during the school day except for P.E. lessons.
- A suitable coat for the weather conditions.
- No jewellery (except stud earrings).
- No nail varnish.
- A suitable bag for books and other work.
- Hair should not be worn extremely short (number 1 cut) and should not include stripes/patterns. Hair should not be unduly attention seeking (colour etc.) and should not include prominent hair accessories.



PE kit

For P.E children require:



- Plain navy shorts, black plimsolls or trainers, plain navy tracksuit bottoms and plain navy jumper for colder months plus a t-shirt in the colour assigned as they enter the school.
- Hair to be tied back.
- No watches should be worn during physical activity.
- Newly pierced ears can be covered with tape for the duration of the lesson. Teachers should not remove or fit children’s earrings. Children should remove their own earrings and if children are unable to remove their own earrings then they should not wear earrings on the days that they have PE.
- Any religious arm bangle that cannot be removed must be covered with a sports sweat band.
- P.E kit in a labelled drawstring bag.

Valuables

Children should not bring valuables or toys from home in to school. If permission for mobile phones has been granted by the school for emergency contact, must be handed into the Class Teacher and must be switched off.

Uniform sales

The PTA sell uniform items, including some with the school badge emblazoned on them. However it is **not** a requirement of our policy that parents purchase uniform via the PTA or any other particular source. Parents are free to choose where they buy items of uniform.

Lost property

All items should be clearly labelled with the child’s name; lost property is stored on the coatrack in the Main Hall for half a term only and then given to charity. Please encourage your child to be responsible for looking after their own belongings.
